Governance

The Group's governing documents are those of the The Scout Association. They consist of a Royal Charter, which in turn gives authority to the Bye Laws of the Association and The Policy, Organisation and Rules of The Scout Association.

The Group is managed by the Group Executive Committee, the members of which are the 'Charity Trustees' of the Scout Group which is an educational charity. As charity trustees they are responsible for complying with legislation applicable to charities. This includes the registration, keeping proper accounts and making returns to the Charity Commission as appropriate.

This Group Executive Committee, comprising the leaders of each section, office holders elected at the AGM and other volunteers to balance with the leaders, exists to support the Group Scout Leader in meeting the responsibilities of the appointments and is responsible for:

The maintenance of Group property;

The raising of funds and the administration of Group finance:

The insurance of persons, property and equipment;

Group public occasions:

Assisting in the recruitment of leaders and other adult support;

Appointing any sub committees that may be required;

Appointing Group Administrators and Advisors other than those who are elected.

Public benefit

The Group meets the Charity Commission's public benefit criteria under both the advancement of education and the advancement of citizenship or community development headings.

The Aim of The Scout Association is to promote the development of young people in achieving their full physical, intellectual, social and spiritual potentials, as individuals, as responsible citizens and as members of their local national and international communities. The method of achieving the Aim of the Association is by providing an enjoyable and attractive scheme of progressive training, based on the Scout Promise and Law and guided by adult leadership.

Reserves policy

The Group's policy on reserves is to hold sufficient resources to continue the charitable activities of the group should income and fundraising activities fall short.

The Group does not hold any insurance policies but maintains an unrestricted insurance fund to pay for any insurance needs.

Financial review

The Group had a deficit of £4,982.90 (2020: deficit £2,089.87).

This reduced reserves to £9,075.64 (2020: £14,058.54) which are considered prudent and sufficient to meet future activities.

1 Accounting policies

Membership subscriptions are recognised on a cash received basis.

Subscriptions are collected from parents and guardians and shared between sections and the group Sections use subs for their activities and the group for group costs.

The group pays subs per child to the Scout District.

Fees for activities represent money collected by sections for camps and other activities.

Assets are written off in the year of purchase.

2 Grants and donations

No grant was received by the group this year.

3 Donations

Money raised on behalf of the Children's Society was £275 (2019: £304.91)

4 Prepayments

Prepayments represent amounts paid in advance for activities, such as deposits for camps, photocopying and amount held on gift cards.

5 Deferred income

Deferred income relates to money collected by sections for future activities.

This will be recognised as income when the activity occurs and matched against the future expense.

6 Related party transactions

Trustees are recompensed for expenses incurred on behalf of the group.

Scout leaders may receive training, qualifications and membership fees paid by the group.

7 Payables

Payables relate to expenses owed to the Beaver leader and not paid before the end of the year.
